*Our **poetry competition for Peace Festival 2020** attracted more than 90 entries from four continents. Participants were from Coventry, other parts of UK, Ireland, Hong Kong, USA, China, Greece, Uganda and India! The judges had a gruelling time because of the high standard of poems.

The virtual awards ceremony was attended by 33 entrants from three continents. That everyone enjoyed the awards ceremony was evident from comments such as "Thank you for this great Coventry event and opportunity for poets to share their work", "Every poem has been creative and written beautifully", etc.

The winner was Joe Reynolds. In second place was Olga Dermott-Bond. Steve Denehan and Russell Berry were in joint third place.

A competition booklet containing the best of the poems will be published in the first quarter of 2021. All winning entries will be published next year in Chatterbox Magazine along with a selection of the Judges' Choice poems.
