Welcome to our December 2021 update

Our news:

*Mary Courtney's three month residency as Artist in Residence at the Central Library ended in the last week of October. Mary held 24 afternoon sessions, attended by a total of 380 people, reflecting Coventry's diversity. The project, promoted as "Making Faces", took off in a big way. Here is a comment made by a visiting group: "The people we invited to create grotesques with Mary had a fantastic experience. Mary's warmth and enthusiasm were infectious."

*Positive Images Festival's Peace poetry competition on the theme of *Faith, Hope and Love* attracted a record 93 entries from Coventry, other cities in UK, Warwickshire and from abroad. The **judging panel**, comprising Emilie Lauren Jones – Coventry Poet Laureate, Kate Hills - Vice Chair of Positive Images Festival and Joe Reynolds – the 2020 Competition winner, was highly impressed by the incredibly high quality of poems.

*The **award ceremony**, held at the Central Methodist Hall on 20th November, was very ably compered by Emilie. The **winner** was Dangermouse aka Scott Healy, who received a prize of £100.00. Two runners up received £60.00 each and 6 highly commended entries £30.00 each.

Attendees provided very positive feedback, their favourite aspects of the event being the celebration of local writers and food – especially samosas!

Two wonderful Coventry University **volunteers** – Simona Pustova and Dominika Gorelik welcomed our visitors and staffed our stall.

A booklet containing an entry from each of the participants will be published in 2022. A selection of poems will also appear in the Chatterbox Magazine.

*Fargo Village was the setting for 2 workshops and a performance event, forming part of our ambitious *When Music Meets Poetry* series, facilitated by Raef Boylan.

Andrea Mbarushimana and Mahendra Patel, leaders of the *first workshop*, spoke about their collaboration as poet and musician and performed an unrehearsed piece. Each poet was paired with a musician. They collaborated, performed and got feedback.

In the **second workshop**, John John Bernard requested participants to write a poem on the theme of love and Amy Kakoura played a melody and introduced participants to ways of creating an ambience.

11 participants from the workshops participated in the performance event on 21st November. The poets and musicians engaged very confidently. The audience was excited to hear that Positive Images Festival had planned more workshops and performances in 2022.

Some of the comments received: A great event; attendance via Zoom; the possibility of including visual arts as well; an excellent opportunity for collaboration between professional artists and non-professional creatives.
